Method — Three domains

Imperial endeavours significantly affected **society, diplomacy and culture** in Europe.

Method — Resistance

The same sentence says imperial endeavours **created resistance to foreign control abroad**. Resistance is a product of empire, not an interruption of it.

Method — ‘Significantly’

The CED rarely uses an intensifier. Here it licenses treating empire as a cause of European developments, not merely a European activity.

Method — Two-sided structure

One European domain, one form of resistance, and a link between them — usually the same technology or institution seen from two ends.
