You must be able to

- state the Spanish pattern
- state the French and Dutch pattern

- identify the variable that most distinguishes them

Method — Spanish

Efforts to extract wealth from the land led them to develop institutions based on subjugating native populations, converting them to Christianity, and incorporating them, along with enslaved and free Africans, into Spanish colonial society. Incorporation, on defined and unequal terms.

Method — French and Dutch

Relatively few Europeans, relying on **trade alliances and intermarriage with American Indians** to build economic and diplomatic relationships and acquire furs and other products for export.

Method — English

A comparatively large number of male and female British migrants, seeking social mobility, economic prosperity, religious freedom, and improved living conditions, focused on agriculture and settled on land taken from Native Americans, from whom they lived separately.

Method — The variable

The relationship to native peoples follows from what each colony wanted. Extraction needs labour; trade needs partners; agriculture needs land — and land is the only one of the three that cannot be shared.

Solution 2.1

Method: French and Dutch

Worked steps

relatively few Europeans **B1**, relying on trade alliances and intermarriage with American Indians to acquire furs and other products for export **B1**.

Worked steps

a comparatively large number of male and female migrants focused on agriculture, settling on land taken from Native Americans and living separately **B1**; they sought social mobility, economic prosperity, religious freedom and improved living conditions **B1**.

Method: The variable

Worked steps

- (a) Spanish — labour; French and Dutch — trading partners; English — land **B3**.
- (b) land cannot be shared, so the English aim required displacement **B1**.
